EDUCATION

- 250 kids provided with art and education kits to stave off summer learning loss 100 virtual "storytime" videos created to model reading for children of all abilities.
- 50,000 laptops and over 10,000 WiFi hotspots distributed to Wake County students in need to learn remotely.
- 2 school and educational center improvement projects completed to beautify the learning environment for kids
- 30 School supply kits assembled and distributed to students in need
- 218 STEM or Literacy learning kits assembled and distributed to students in need
- 5,000 books distributed to kids and families in need
- 6 teachers honored with teacher appreciation gifts



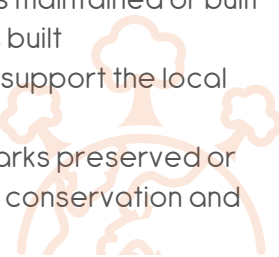

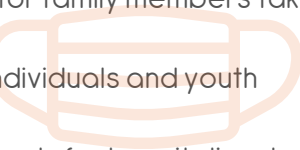
ENVIRONMENT

- 9 community farms or gardens maintained or built
- 9 animal or pollinator habitats built
- 30 trees or plants planted to support the local environment
- 1.5 miles of nature trails and parks preserved or cleaned up for environmental conservation and community benefit



HEALTH

- 25,000 mask kits assembled for distribution to vulnerable populations across Wake County
- 430 meals lovingly prepared for family members taking care of chronically ill children
- 150 care kits assembled for individuals and youth suffering from illness
- 2,000 handmade courage cards for hospitalized children, including 300 cards in Spanish



CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

- 20,000 voter registration texts sent to help North Carolinians register and make a plan to vote
- 170 community members completed learning about local issues such as food insecurity and education

HUNGER

- 15 new "middle mile" drivers recruited to help transport food leftover from farms and restaurants to area Food Banks and food pantries.
- 147,191 meals prepared and packaged to feed families and youth in need
- 5,273 meals served to neighbors in need
- 170 meal kits assembled and delivered to food-insecure kids
- 203 families received groceries to help them get through a difficult time

EMPLOYMENT

- 120 women seeking employment received help practicing for job interviews



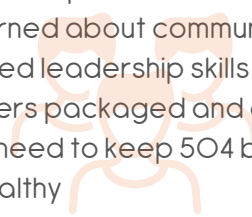
SENIORS

- 1,106 messages of companionship and support sent to isolated seniors



YOUTH

- 500 kids mentored, tutored, or provided with companionship
- 173 teens learned about community issues and developed leadership skills
- 25,200 diapers packaged and distributed to families in need to keep 504 babies clean and healthy
- 900 pounds of clothing sorted and distributed to kids in need



POVERTY & HOMELESSNESS

- 38 individuals or family members experiencing homelessness received help filing for their stimulus or unemployment benefits
- 1 home repaired or built for a family in need
- 116 home supply kits assembled and distributed to neighbors in need
- 450 hygiene and survival kits assembled and distributed to people experiencing homelessness
- 70 cards of encouragement sent to men experiencing homelessness and isolation
- 12 homes insulated with baffles
- 200 parents in need were able to provide holiday gifts for their families



ANIMALS

- 61 basic needs kits created or collected for adoptable shelter animals
