EDUCATION

- 8,100 students received bags of books at 13 schools during Operation Empower Readers
- 1,335 books collected during 7 book drives to bolster literacy for kids
- 6 School and educational center improvement projects completed to beautify the environment for kids
- 155 teachers honored with teacher appreciation gifts
- 475 student supply kits assembled for youth in need
- 100 educational support binders for teachers and 50 learning binders for students assembled

ENVIRONMENT

- 2.94 tons/220 bags of trash picked up at five City of Raleigh sites during Think Clean Raleigh
- 150 reusable totes for youth created out of upcycled t-shirts during Operation Tee to Tote
- 24 routes and 130 square miles were covered by 160 volunteer citizen scientists during Urban Heat Mapping
- 8 Projects to build/maintain Community Gardens, Parks, and Nature Trails

HEALTH

- 25,000 mask kits assembled for distribution to vulnerable populations across Wake County during Operation Mask Up
- 1,180 parents and children in need benefited from the 295 Healthy Home Packs assembled and donated during Operation Healthy Homes
- 500 people vaccinated at COVID-19 clinics
- 395 Dignity Bags created and distributed to neighbors in need of hygiene items
- 63 lives potentially saved as 21 pints of blood were collected at a blood drive
- 225 First Responders honored with Appreciation Bags

HUNGER

- 210,086 Meals prepared and packaged to feed families and youth in need
- 49,243 boxes of food distributed to children and families in need during Operation Big Bus Food Truck
- 976 Meals served to neighbors in need
- 1,114 Grocery bags and placemats decorated with messages of hope for clients of food pantries, shelters

That is a huge annual undertaking, and it takes a ton of volunteers to make it happen. SKILLS-BASED

- 95 professionals provided 165 hours of pro bono consulting or other professional services to 29 nonprofits
- 214 volunteers took on projects during our Virtual Volunteer-a-Thon resulting in 720 volunteer hours for 22 causes

SENIORS

- 480 care cards with messages of companionship and support sent to isolated seniors
- 156 wellness calls were made to connect with isolated seniors and schedule meal deliveries

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

- 1,088 Community members completed learning about local issues, such as education and food insecurity
- 100+ volunteers came together to create art, community, and connection and to DO GOOD during our Community Mural Project

YOUTH

- 94 youth learned about community issues, developed leadership skills to become social impact superstars and collected over 9,000 donated items during our Kids Helping Kids - Summer of Service
- 100+ Youth and their families took on a variety of remote and in person projects benefiting hundreds of community members in need during Family Volunteer Days
- 7,272 community members benefited from 26 service projects taken on by teens and families in our Teens Change the World program
- 3,000 youth were mentored, tutored, and provided with companionship at the FAST Initiative's 6 learning centers

POVERTY & HOMELESSNESS

- 1,700 families in need received 40,000 diapers and 49 individuals/groups led supply drives gathering thousands of period products, adult incontinence and baby diapers during Operation Bare Necessities
- 3,875 lbs. of clothing sorted and distributed to kids in need
- 200 parents in need were able to provide holiday gifts to their families
- 7,500 children received Angel Tree Christmas gifts thanks to hundreds of volunteers that helped with donations and distribution
- 120,000 diapers wrapped and distributed to 2,400 babies
- 300+ coats sorted for distribution to those in need of warmth

ANIMALS

- 200 Care kits/blankets/toys for adoptable shelter animals
- Items prepared for animal habitats at a nonprofit wildlife sanctuary
